BTEC National Diploma in Photography (Art and Design Practice) - CA304

This Level 3 course explores a diverse range of technical and creative disciplines within Photography.

Students will build a grounding foundation in both digital and film formats, developing skills that will enhance them to progress to HE courses or straight into the industry.

COURSE DETAILS

Students will learn how to use professional camera equipment, darkroom, studio and editing software, exploring a range of topics within photography such as, portraits, journalism, experimental and advertising, as well as looking into the work of key practitioners, learning how to analyse and critically reflect, both their own work and the work of others.

There is also opportunities to exhibit work, take part in workshops, meet guest speakers and trips, students will be able to explore and develop photography skills on this exciting and diverse course.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

This is a Study Programme for students who are 16-18 years of age.

To study a Level 3 qualification, you will need:

A minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grades 4-9 including English and/or Maths (or L2 Functional Skills in English and/or Maths)

OR

A relevant Level 2 qualification and English or Maths at Grade 4 or above (or L2 Functional Skills in English and/or Maths)

If you have experience in photography please bring some examples of your work
