



Public and Uniformed Services - K020

This course is designed to equip you with the knowledge, understanding and skills required for success when moving towards a career in the uniformed and public sector services, for example, police, emergency fire services, security, prison services or the armed services.

Aims and objectives of this qualification.

The qualification aims to provide learners with:.

- an understanding of the uniformed public services sector
- the opportunity to investigate career opportunities in the uniformed services
- The opportunity to investigate volunteering roles and the transferable workplace skills volunteering can provide
- the ability to prepare for a recruitment interview
- an understanding of the personal commitment and fitness requirements needed to be employed in a uniformed service role
- an understanding of the importance health and hygiene for those in uniformed service role
- The opportunity to understand and develop the skills and qualities needed to work in a range of uniformed services e.g. teamwork, communication, problem solving, navigation and drill

- Unit 03 Develop team working and problem solving skills
- Unit 04 Health & Safety in uniformed services

- Unit 06 Follow uniformed service routine
- Unit 07 Exploring equality and diversity for the uniformed services
- Unit 08 Carry out map reading and navigation
- Unit 12 Explore volunteering and volunteering opportunities

ENTRY GUIDELINES

Relevant Level 1 qualification or minimum of 3 GCSEs at Grade 3/D or above preferably including English and Maths.

Satisfactory interview, assessment, school report and/or satisfactory reference.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

Each candidate is required to create a portfolio of evidence which demonstrates achievement of 100% of the learning outcomes and assessment criteria associated with each unit. Learning outcomes and assessment criteria specify what each candidate has to achieve.

The main pieces of evidence for the portfolio could include, where relevant:

- candidate's proof of work
- assessor observation — completed observational checklists and related action plans
- witness testimony
- practical observations
- worksheets

- assignments/projects/reports
- record of professional discussion
- record of oral and written questioning
- candidate and peer reports
- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Are you aged 16-18?

Study programmes are full-time courses for 16-18 year olds which include:

- A qualification such as BTEC Extended Diploma
- Meaningful work experience or preparation for work
- English and maths, if you don't already have GCSE grade A* - C (grade 4 or above) in English and maths
- Non-study activities such as tutorials, voluntary work, fund-raising/charity work, sport or trips

WHERE CAN I PROGRESS TO?

This course can be a stepping stone for successful candidates towards entering initial employment as, for example, a police community support officer, an army soldier or a Royal Air Force airman/woman. Entry to any of the public or private uniformed services, further education. Opportunities exist to progress onto the Edexcel National Diploma in Public Services.
